	I object because: A huge increase in noise, pollution, traffic and dust from HGVs mean current and future residents have a materially negative impact on their quality of life, health and road safety. There will also be a negative impact on environment, biodiversity and climate change, impacting

residents.

Local residents would not be getting same benefits of ERYC policies as other East Riding residents as it would mean many commitments would have to be disregarded to suit this application.

Traffic Calming Policy: "Traffic calming requests will be prioritised using a weighted rating system based on local traffic and environmental criteria including the potential for the reduction of personal injury collisions, traffic volumes, pedestrian and cycling activity and the level and type of adjacent property development".

Disregarded.

Disregarded in that:

- Vulnerable would NOT be protected on roads.
- HGVs would discourage pedestrians and cyclists from using the road, having a materially negative effect on their physical and mental health.
