This will be further eroded under the proposals I believe.</p> <p>We need to protect our green spaces for the sake of future generations as well as present ones and the animals whose homes are in our areas.</p> <p>We have already seen house prices affected but I have seen no study around ensuring that those properties closest to the sites are not going to suffer from the constant digging, "fracking or chemical enhanced extraction".</p> <p>ERYC need to act now as part of its Climate Emergency response to keep the countryside as it is and to seek newer forms of energy and not utilise fuels of the past.</p> |
